



## Lyon Elementary School 2011-2012 Supply Lists

### Kindergarten

- 1 backpack
- 24 - #2 pencils (Ticonderoga)
- 1 small pencil box
- 16 glue sticks
- 3 boxes of 24 crayons
- 2 2-pocket folders
- 1 bottle hand sanitizer
- 1 box facial tissue (Kleenex)
- 1 box/bag of non-perishable snacks (Crackers, raisins, etc.)
- 1 earthquake kit
- 1 pair children's scissors
- 1 box colored pencils
- 1 container sanitizing wipes

### First Grade

#### **Community supplies**

- 3 boxes of 24 crayons
- 3 large glue sticks
- 3 large erasers
- 2 large boxes of Kleenex
- 2 large bottles of hand sanitizer

#### **Individual Supplies**

- 5-2-pocket folders
- 1 backpack
- 1 earthquake kit
- \$6.00 for Scholastic News
- 3 wide ruled spiral notebooks

### Second Grade

- 15 folders (with 3 metal prongs & pockets- often found at Target for \$.10 each)
- 1 box of 24 Crayola Crayons
- 1 dozen pencils, #2 yellow
- 5 large pink erasers
- 1 1" 3- ring binder
- 1 glue stick
- 3 boxes of Kleenex
- 1 package of wide ruled paper
- 1 backpack
- 1 earthquake kit

### Third Grade

#### **All Community Supplies**

- 3 wide ruled spiral notebooks
- 1 24 pack of crayons
- 2 boxes of tissue
- 3 dozen (36) pencils
- 3 glue sticks
- 1 pair scissors
- 1 bottle of hand sanitizer (12 oz. or larger)
- 2 large erasers
- 5 pocket folders
- 2 packages of wide ruled paper
- 1 crayon supply box
- 1 earthquake kit

### Fourth Grade

#### **Individual Supplies**

- 3 Mead composition book with lined paper (usually have a black and white cover)
- 3 spiral notebooks with at least 80 sheets of paper
- 3 pocket folders

#### **Community Supplies**

- 2 large packs of college-ruled notebook paper
- 6 dozen #2 pencils
- 1 package of colored pencils
- 2 large white or pink erasers
- 3 glue sticks
- 1 package of pencil eraser tops
- 1 3-ring binder
- 2 black Sharpies (pens)
- 3 large boxes of Kleenex
- 2 bottles of hand sanitizer
- 1 earthquake kit

## **Fifth Grade**

### ***Individual Supplies***

- 1 MEAD Composition Book with lined paper
- 2 spiral notebooks with plain cover and at least 80 sheets of lined paper
- 1 soft eraser
- 2 black ballpoint pens
- 3 pocket folders

### ***Community Supplies***

- 4 large packs of wide ruled notebook paper
- 3 dozen #2 pencils
- 1 small package of Crayola Crayons
- 1 package of colored pencils
- 1 glue sticks
- 1 black Sharpie pen (fine point permanent black marker)
- 2 large boxes of Kleenex
- 2 bottles of hand sanitizer
- 1 earthquake kit
- \$3.00 for Student Planner

## **Autism Class Supply List**

- 1 backpack
- 2 spiral notebooks
- 1 folder
- 2 glue sticks
- 1 box #2 pencils
- 3 erasers
- 1 bottle hand sanitizer
- 1 box kleenex
- 1 large box of cereal/crackers/snack items
- 1 change of clothes (socks, shoes & underwear)
- Diapers, wipes & gloves
- 1 earthquake kit

Feel free to donate clothes your child has outgrown for back up for classmates.

***\*Pencils purchased at the Dollar Stores or ones which are decorated tend to not sharpen very well. Please don't buy any fancy items because all students will use them and it can cause conflicts.***

### **Items Contained in an Emergency/Earthquake Kit**

The staff at Mary Lyon is recommending that each of you prepare an Emergency/Earthquake Supply Kits for each of your children. If there is an emergency at school and your child needed to stay, this Emergency Kit would provide them with their own supply of food, etc. If the kit is not used this year, your child can bring it to their next classroom or school. Here are some ideas for the kit:

- Use the gallon size Ziploc freezer bag for the kit
- Enclose a picture and family emergency information on an index card  
(**Include on the card:** date, student's name, teacher's name, home address, age, home phone, parents name, parents daytime phone, people to contact in case of emergency and medical information)
- 1-2 cans of food (like chili, ravioli, etc.)
- 1-2 mini size boxes of cereal
- Boxed juice or small bottle of water
- Small box of crackers ("Handi" snacks)
- 1 chocolate bar (M & M or Hershey Kisses)
- 1 large "Hefty" type garbage sack (for clothing/weather protection)
- A note of reassurance from you to your child that will provide him/her with comfort during this time.

Remember, all items need to be non-perishable.

*If it is easier, many grocery stores sell prepared emergency kits. Look for these kits in August and September. Whether your family makes the Emergency Kit or buys one, help your child be prepared and feel safe.*
