

**BOZE ELEMENTARY SCHOOL  
DRESS CODE**

Boze believes that students are important and want a disciplined environment for all to learn and achieve.

The dress code for Boze will be designated for all students in grades K-5. The following requirements have been established:

Sandals only when secured with a back strap. No Heelys (skateboard shoes) No flip-flops.  Socks <b><u>MUST</u></b> be worn.

**Shorts and skirts are to be no more than 3 inches above the knee.**

Pants/shorts are to be worn around the waist, with a belt if needed (no sagging). As in the past, students are always expected to come to school clean and well groomed. Short shorts, tank tops, bare midriffs are not acceptable for school.

**Students are expected to comply with the Dress Code.** All students registered on the first day of school will be in designated attire the first week of school. All students registering after school begins will be given one week to conform to the uniform Dress Code. Non-Compliance with Dress Code may result in, but not limited to the following consequences:

Step 1	Warning, Child and teacher will contact parent.
Step 2	Warning. Non-compliance recorded, copy sent home with student/returned with parent signature.
Step 3	Parent contacted to schedule a problem-solving conference, letter mailed.

**Policy Statement**

The Board of Directors of Tacoma School District #10 authorizes school and alternative programs to adopt and implement student dress codes. The dress code may include the requirement that students who attend the school wear a uniform. A school or alternative program shall obtain student, staff and parental input prior to implementing a school uniform requirement. A decision that students must wear uniforms shall be made, and students and parents notified, no later than the last day of May in the school year prior to the implementation of the uniform requirement. A school that adopts a requirement that students wear uniforms shall accommodate students who cannot afford uniforms so that the uniform requirement is not an unfair barrier to school attendance and student participation.
