

First Creek Middle School Dress Code

First Creek's dress code ("Eagle Gear") is designed to enhance the learning environment. The dress code is enacted to keep students safe and to teach students how to dress properly in a formal situation.

The standard for professional or formal clothing includes the following:

- Clothes must be neat and clean.
- Clothing should be modest which means not tight or revealing.
- Clothes should be well-fitted with no alterations or modifications and no adornments such as sequins, embroidery, patches, logos, artfully placed rips or tears, rubber bands, etc.

TOPS

- a. Collared shirts in solid colors only – navy blue, black or white.
- b. Approved FCMS hooded sweatshirts and logos only.
- c. Other sweatshirts, shirts, and sweaters must be solid colored.
- d. A shirt with a collar must be worn under sweatshirts or sweaters.

PANTS, SKIRTS, SHORTS, SKORTS, JUMPERS, CAPRIS

- a. Solid colors only – navy blue or black.
- b. Normal fit.
- c. Jeans may not be worn.

SHOES

- a. Navy blue, black, or white.
- b. All shoes must have closed heels and toes.
- c. Any heel must be less than 2".

P.E. UNIFORMS

- a. Recommended uniforms may be purchased at First Creek Middle School.
- b. Navy blue, black, white, or gray shorts or sweat pants only.
- c. Only plain gray or white t-shirts.
- d. Tennis shoes and white socks only.
- e. P.E. clothing may only be worn in P.E.
- f. No street clothing permitted in P.E.

OTHER INFORMATION

- Coats and outer wear must be in lockers.
- Clothes must fit normally and conform to professional dress standards.
- Headgear may not be worn.
- All clothes must be in good repair and in good taste.
- Students wearing questionable items may be sent to the office for approval.
- Students are required to be in dress code during school related events.
- Students will remain in dress code after school when participating in any non-athletic school activity unless given specific permission to do otherwise.
- Current school ID cards are an expected part of the dress code.

Administration reserves the right to restrict clothing items or accessories that disrupt teaching and learning. Items that promote or encourage violence or hate, that advertise inappropriate messages, or that signify gang affiliation are prohibited. Such items may not be specified in the dress code at the printing of this handbook. Look for information in the monthly newsletter concerning dress code changes.
