

# Incidents – Major Injury

The U.S. Department of Education has instituted a new requirement that we report Major Injuries in relation to certain incident types. Per the OSPI Bulletin B020-10AttachB, “A major injury is when one or more students, school personnel, or other persons on school grounds require **professional medical attention**. Examples of major injuries include stab or bullet wounds, concussions, fractured or broken bones, or cuts requiring stitches.” Incidents involved are: Fighting (do not include verbal confrontations, tussles, or other minor confrontations), Assault, Homicide, Malicious Harassment, Kidnapping, Rape or Robbery.

This information will need to be entered into eSIS for current year (2009-10) incidents, where appropriate, as well as on all future major incidents. There are two ways to access this information:

The Major Injury indicator will be held in the “Motivation” field, which is now a required field for those Incident/Offense types listed above.
