

PURPOSE STATEMENT

The Transportation Department provides safe, efficient, and reliable on-time to and from school transportation for all eligible students and provides school buses for all extra-curricular activities, with well-trained positive staff that satisfies the customer's expectations.

The Transportation Department ensures that safety is paramount. District buses that are approximately thirteen years old will be replaced annually by using the state depreciation payments. The replacement schedule reflects replacing around 5-6 buses yearly. Propane-fueled buses are replacing some of the diesel vehicles. The department selects/recommends bus drivers that meet all District, State, and Federal requirements. The department plans and organizes all bus driver training. Drivers are trained in student management, rules of the road, customer service, and a state-mandated curriculum. The department will be moving toward a district-wide student tracking and parent portal system that utilizes ID cards for students to tap on and off a bus and gives parents notifications when buses arrive at bus stops. All buses will be equipped with tablets and are currently equipped with video recorders and GPS (Global Positioning System).

STAKEHOLDERS

The department serves the following: Preschool special ed; K-12 regular and special ed; Community Based Transition Program (CBT); Highly capable; McKinney Vento and Foster; Extended Learning Opportunity (ELO); Sports and Field Trips; Band; After school activities; Student administrative transfers; and shuttles between programs.

CASE STATEMENT

Transportation supports all types of learning opportunities available to students. If a student has a way to school, they are more likely to attend. All students will have equal access to transportation services. One of the safest and most efficient modes of transportation is a yellow school bus.

- 3. We will decrease absenteeism from 7.1% to 5% by the end of 2022 as measured by actual attendance.
