

Nursing Assistant (CNA)?

Summer 2021 CNA Program Overview

The Tacoma Public School's Certified Nursing Assistant (CNA) Program is an opportunity to gain hands-on experience in the nursing field and begin to develop the skills needed to pursue in a career in healthcare. Up to twenty four juniors from Tacoma Public Schools will be selected to participate in this FREE six-week program. Students must be 16 years of age or older when the program begins

Participants begin with a four-week virtual learning experience, remote and in-person labs designed to give them the necessary knowledge and skills to work as a CNA in the health care setting. This is followed by a one-week hands-on clinical training experience at a nursing home or hospital.

Upon completion of the program students are qualified to take the Washington State Certified Nursing Assistant exam to receive their CNA certification. After completing the state exam, students will be eligible for a program completion stipend, 8 college credits, and the opportunity to apply for a paid internship in the health care setting during Fall 2021.



Employment growth

CNA employment opportunities will grow by 17% by the year 2024, according to the Bureau of Labor Statistics.

Large employment sector

Medicine is the third largest employment sector in both the U.S. as a whole and the Tacoma metropolitan region.

College Advantage

Earning a CNA can provide an advantage in college applications. Many medical programs recommend or require earning a CNA as a first step, before RN or LPN courses.

Summer 2021 Program Timeline
