

#### Dear Students, Parents, or Guardians,

Welcome to Tacoma Community College's (TCC) 2018-2019 College in the High School (CitHS) Program. TCC in the High School provides the opportunity for high school sophomores, juniors, and seniors to be enrolled in college-level courses and earn college credit all within the familiarity of their own high school classroom. These courses are taught by your high school teachers who have been approved by TCC and work exclusively with TCC faculty to ensure the classes meet the same standards as a similar course on campus.

The decision to start college course-taking early is an important one. Frequently, a student may be academically prepared for college-level courses, but may find social or emotional demands overwhelming. The most successful college students are highly motivated, work independently, take initiative, have good study skills, are self-disciplined and are able to complete a variety of assignments with little direction from instructors. Students, parents/guardians and counselors should carefully consider whether TCC in the High School appropriately meets the student's needs.

The details of the program can be found in the <u>High School Student/Parent/Guardian</u> <u>Handbook</u> which outlines the Tacoma Community College in the High School Program as well as on the TCC Website (<a href="http://www.tacomacc.edu/academics-programs/college-high-school/">http://www.tacomacc.edu/academics-programs/college-high-school/</a>). I strongly encourage you to read this handbook thoroughly to ensure you understand the program before applying. A copy will be made available with this letter.

TCC will be offering a number of courses during the 2018-2019 school year which can be found in **Enclosure 1: Class Schedule**. This document highlights the TCC Course, TCC and Tacoma Public School (TPS) Course Titles, TCC Class Number and Prerequisite as well as Semester Offered, Credits for the Course and what TCC Quarter students will enroll. It also identifies the TPS Faculty teaching the course as well as the school where it is being offered. It is important to understand that each student must meet the established TCC Prerequisite in order to take the course. **Enclosure 2: Milestone Chart** shows what high school/college courses you must have completed to take the various College in the High School courses offered this year at the various high schools. Please follow the steps below to apply and enroll.

#### **STEP 1: APPLY**

This fall and winter TCC will offer two <u>Orientation/Enrollment Periods</u>. However, prior to enrolling each student must <u>APPLY</u> to TCC either in person or online following the instructions on page 13 of the Student/Parent/Guardian Handbook. There are also videos on the website to help you navigate the application and enrollment process.

However, if you have, or are unsure if you have previously applied to TCC, please verify by calling Admissions at 253-566-5325. Applying a second time will cause significant problems with your records.



# You must complete the application process at least one week prior to attending the Orientation/Enrollment Period.

To determine what **Orientation/Enrollment Period** you should attend go to the Class Schedule in Enclosure 1 and go to the class you want to enroll in and find the Column entitled **"TCC Quarter Students Enroll"** and it will indicated what period to attend.

#### **STEP 2: ENROLLING**

Once you have applied and received your student ID number you are ready to enroll for classes at the **Orientation/Enrollment Period**. You may enroll in classes either in person at TCC or through the Enrollment process on page 17 of the Handbook. <u>It is strongly recommended</u> that you enroll in person!

One week prior to attending the Orientation/Enrollment Period send your unofficial transcript, Smarter Balanced scores, AP/IB scores, and/or SAT/ACT scores to the following email and indicate you are a potential College in the High School student: <a href="mailto:unofficialtrans@tacomacc.edu">unofficialtrans@tacomacc.edu</a>. Your documents will be utilized to determine your placement and if you have met the prerequisites when you enroll for your classes.

**Orientation/Enrollment Period 1** is for those students signing up for 1<sup>st</sup> semester courses only (see "TCC Quarter Students Enroll" Column in Enclosure 1) and will have two sessions as indicated below.

**Orientation/Enrollment Period 2** is for 2<sup>nd</sup> semester courses and year-long courses (see "TCC **Quarter Students Enroll"** Column in Enclosure 1) and will also have two sessions. The intent of these orientations is to familiarize the student with the campus and the numerous resources at their disposal as well as assist them through the **enrollment process**. Regardless of whether you are already a TCC student or not you are strongly encouraged to come and learn about your college and how to navigate its impressive support capabilities.

#### STEP 3: Payment

The cost of each credit is \$65 which is a 38% savings from the regular tuition. TCC has worked diligently to devise a funding strategy that will also enable it to offer low cost alternative pricing for those students participating in the Free & Reduced (F&R) Meal Program. The discounted prices per course are:
